

A. TYPE OF GRANT

Webs of Safety and Care

The Webs of Safety and Care (WSC) grant is available to organisations and networks led by women and non-binary¹ human rights defenders and activists. WSC Grants seek to provide women, trans and non-binary human rights defenders with sustained access to resources for resilient movement infrastructure with collective care. This means the grant will seek to support holistic wellbeing, care and safety mechanism to deepen resilience, which would sustain lives, movements and long-term social change/ justice work.

C. GRANT CRITERIA

Women and non-binary activists and defender, their network and communities can propose initiative that:

- include **complete assessment of safety and care** or is based on such assessment that have previously been conducted. The documentation of the holistic safety and care assessment may be required.
- have clear link between the safety and care needs identified and how the proposed initiative will address them.
- Have clear strategy of how the initiative will be implemented and what is expected as an outcome
 that is towards building or strengthening webs of safety and care for women and non-binary activists
 and defenders or their organisations or networks.
- that must be led/conducted by organisations, collectives and networks led by women and nonbinary human rights defenders.
- The initiatives as well as the organisations and networks must be supported by networks of human rights, women's rights and other related networks at local or national levels. This includes UAF A&P network of Advisors and other partners.

We do not fund:

- Short term safety and well-being measures and immediate needs. This support can be assessed through out <u>security and well-being grant</u>.
- Cis-gender² male led groups and organisations
- Regular programmatic areas of the organisations and networks including advocacy, capacity-building, service providing or other regular work of the organisations, collectives or network.
- Activities or projects addressing immediate humanitarian crises or natural disasters
- Activities or projects focused on development aid or charity assistance
- Regular operating budgets and/or bridge funding (to fill a funding gap)

¹ Non-binary is an umbrella term referring to individuals whose gender identity and/or gender expression are not exclusively masculine or feminine, male or female — thus, are outside of the gender binary and cisnormativity. UAF A&P uses this term to encompass androgyny, polygender, genderqueer, gender fluid and a-gender individuals.

² Cisgender Males are individuals who identify as male and who were assigned male at birth
